Have you heard of Krokodil?

Krokodil is originally from Russia, the medical name for it is desomorphine. Those who use this drug usually begin with heroin and move onto Krokodil. The name came from the skin of a user becoming scaly, green and bumpy. It is common for gangrene to persist, as well as the skin rotting off completely leaving bone exposed. The withdrawals are also more powerful than heroin withdrawals. The withdrawals with heroin usually last up to ten days, with Krokodil it can last up to a month of unbearable pain. This is the strongest level of addiction and the hardest to get through doctors are saying. If the addict does manage to make it to recovery they may be left with permanent damage. Some of the damage includes speech impediment, vacant gaze and erratic movement. Learn more by clicking the link below.

Marijuana is Now Legalized in 30 States


